My name is Kassidy Washburn. I graduated from Potter Valley High School. I will be attending Montana State majoring in Fish and Wildlife Management and Ecology.




Hi, my name is Angel Mann and I just graduated from Potter Valley High School. At this time I have not chosen a school but wherever I end up I will be studying Kinesology.
